COME SEE A MAN!

Dear Chosen One: Come See a Man!

These were the words shouted by the Samaritan woman as she ran through her village (John 4:29). Today, I echo those same words in your community: **Come see a Man who is the Messiah!** He told me everything about myself. He made the crooked path straight and the rough ground smooth. God loves us so much that He left His divinity, wrapped Himself in humanity, and went to the cross to die for our sins—**mine and yours.**

Come see a Man! Some people go to church for various reasons: to see their friends, to find a mate, to mind other people's business, to enjoy the praise dancers, or to hear the choir sing. Yes, some also go to hear the Word of God. But today, I want to challenge and redirect your church-going motives.

Come to church to **know Jesus more deeply**—to build a personal relationship with Him, to cast your cares upon Him, and to worship Him in spirit and in truth. Come expecting a miracle. Come to reverence the **King of Kings and Lord of Lords.** What the pastor cannot do for you, Jesus can. What the ministers are unable to fix, Jesus will handle. **He is the Lover of our souls—the Author and Finisher of our faith.**

The U.S. government sells AAA bonds—investments that increase in value over time but only reach their full worth at maturity. This is much like Christians: we have intrinsic value, but we become even more impactful when we are **spiritually mature** and fully committed to the work God has called us to.

I am weary of hearing people say, **“I don't go to church because of the hypocrites.”** I tell them: pray

for those living contrary to God's Word, but do not allow their behavior to deter your walk. However, while encouraging others to ignore the ungodly, the **church is suffering**—losing members, tarnishing its reputation, and discouraging those who genuinely strive to live righteously. The Bible says, **“Judgment begins in the house of the Lord”** (1 Peter 4:17).

So today, I say this publicly: **Separate yourself** from the ungodly. Have nothing to do with those who are lukewarm, wishy-washy, self-centered, and immoral; **those who profess Christianity** but do not live by it (1 Corinthians 5:9–13). Do not follow anyone who is not following Christ. The Bible warns us: **“Do not be unequally yoked with the unrighteous”** and **“Do not be entangled again with a yoke of bondage”** (Galatians 5:1).

Inspect the lives of those claiming to be Christians. If they are not bearing fruit, they are **phony** and deceiving you. There is **wheat and there is tare**, and without discernment, you may confuse one for the other. Both grow together, but the Bible says at harvest time, the Farmer (Jesus) will separate them—the tares will be gathered and burned, and the wheat will be brought into the barn (Matthew 13:30). **Pray for spiritual discernment** so you can distinguish the true followers of Christ from impostors.

The Apostle Paul declared, **“I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me”** (Galatians 2:20). Many cannot identify with this truth because **sin still reigns** in their lives. If you want to see Jesus, you must crucify your flesh and focus on Him.

COME SEE A MAN WHO IS THE MASSIAH.

Come see a Man—His name is Jesus!

Even when you can't see Him, you can feel His presence. He promised, *"I will never leave you nor forsake you."* He is the **Way Maker**—the Way, the Truth, and the Life (John 14:6). If you want to find the way, follow those who are following Jesus.

Many say, **"I love Jesus, and I want to follow Him, but..."** There is no **"but."** Get rid of your *but*—it's in the way. You may need to let go of some possessions, comfort, habits, or even friends to follow Jesus. He accepts you just as you are, but you **won't stay as you are**—no one can remain unchanged after encountering Him.

Trust Jesus. Will you trust Him when He says no? Will you trust Him when your plans fall apart? Will you trust Him when the doctors give a hopeless report? When your children rebel, your spouse leaves, your job disappears, or your friends abandon you—**will you still trust Him?**

Even when it feels like you're losing the battle—**trust Him.** When your bank account is empty and your heart is broken—**trust Him.** Jesus has **never lost a battle.** He is not a man that lies. He will never forsake you. His love never fails.

I encourage you today: **Stay positive, be encouraged.** The battle is not yours—it belongs to the Lord. Many are called, but **you are chosen.** Let your light shine in the darkness. Love one another, for **love conquers hate.** Preach, teach, and share the Word of God. It is powerful. And remember—when God stops speaking, so should you.

I love you all. Now go forth and **imitate the One who sends me—JESUS.**

Spiritual Nuggets to Munch On: Storms come to **test your faith**, even when you are in the will of God.

- Storms come to **reveal what's inside of you**—so you can confront it and grow.
- You can be **obeying God** and still face a storm—it may be His way of teaching you to **trust Him more deeply.**

- In the midst of the storm, you must trust **God's power** to rebuke it.
- You are **never alone** in the storm—**Jesus is always with you.**
- God uses storms to refine your **faith, obedience, submission, and character.**
- Storms remind us that we are all a **work in progress**—God isn't finished with you yet.
- Storms stir up discomfort—**keep your mind stayed on Jesus** (Isaiah 26:3).
- Storms are **temporary**—they do not last forever.
- Storms will come, but when you're **rooted and grounded in Jesus, you will overcome.**
- You don't have power in the storm—**Jesus does** (Mark 4:39).
- Don't focus on the storm—**fix your eyes on Jesus**, the Author and Finisher of your faith (Hebrews 12:2).
- You cannot have a **testimony** without passing the **storm test.**
- You can run, but you can't hide—**storms have a divine appointment** with you.
- Don't let the storm frustrate you—**trust God for a redemptive outcome.**
- See the storm as a **tool God is using to shape you** for His purpose.
- While in the storm, take time for **spiritual self-inventory.**
- **Never blame others** for your storm—seek God's purpose in it.
- Everyone has their own storm—**don't compare your journey to someone else's.**
- What you learned in the last storm, you won't have to repeat in the next—**growth brings promotion.**
- Avoid **self-pity**—it clouds your vision in the storm.
- What the storm brings out of you is what **God wants to heal and transform.**
- Lessons learned in the storm will **elevate you** to a new level in Christ.
